1. Read and answer the following chapter review questions from Washington: In The Pacific Northwest. **Chapter review questions must be completed to 80% accuracy or better.**

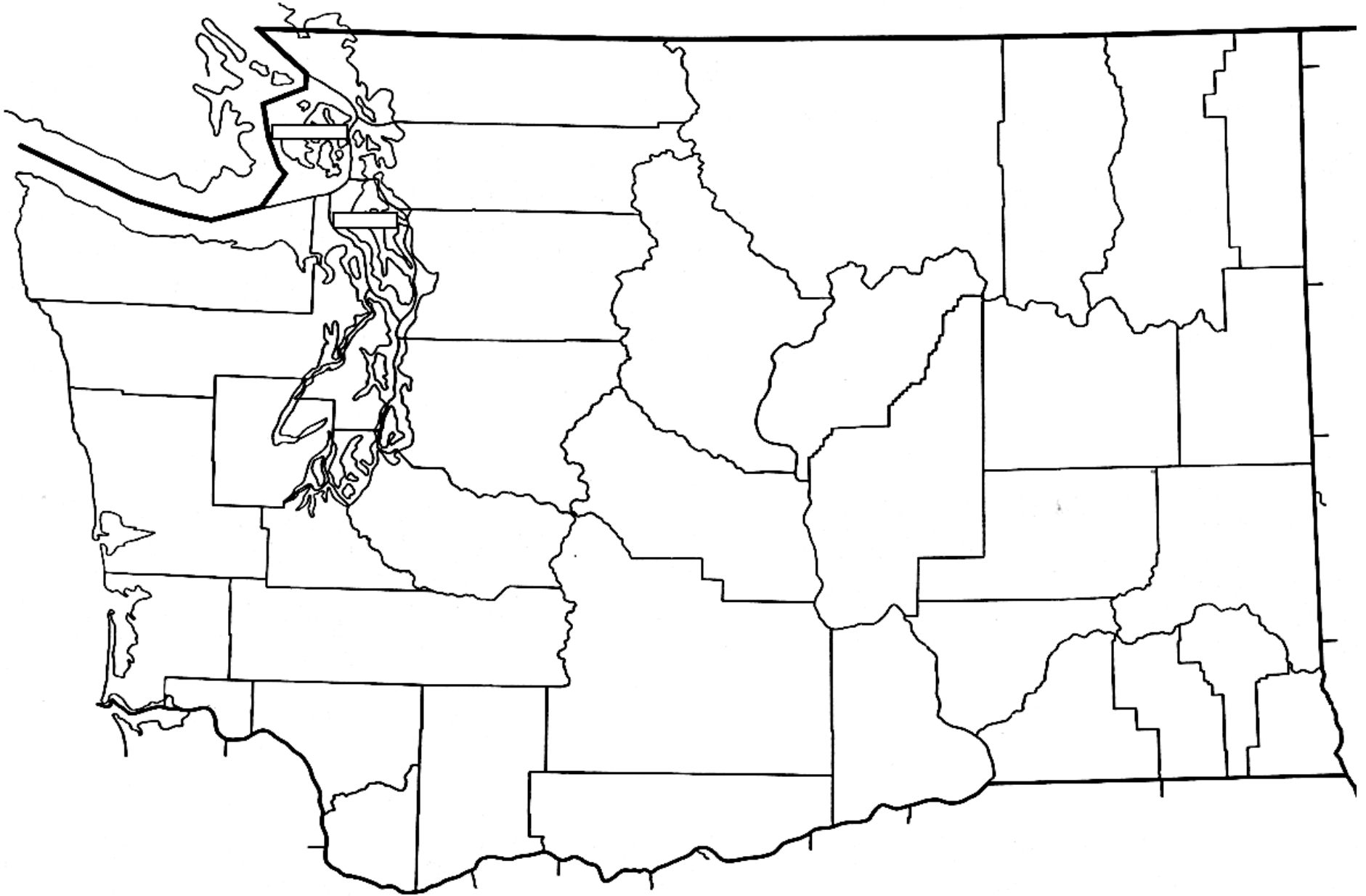

  - Columbia Basin

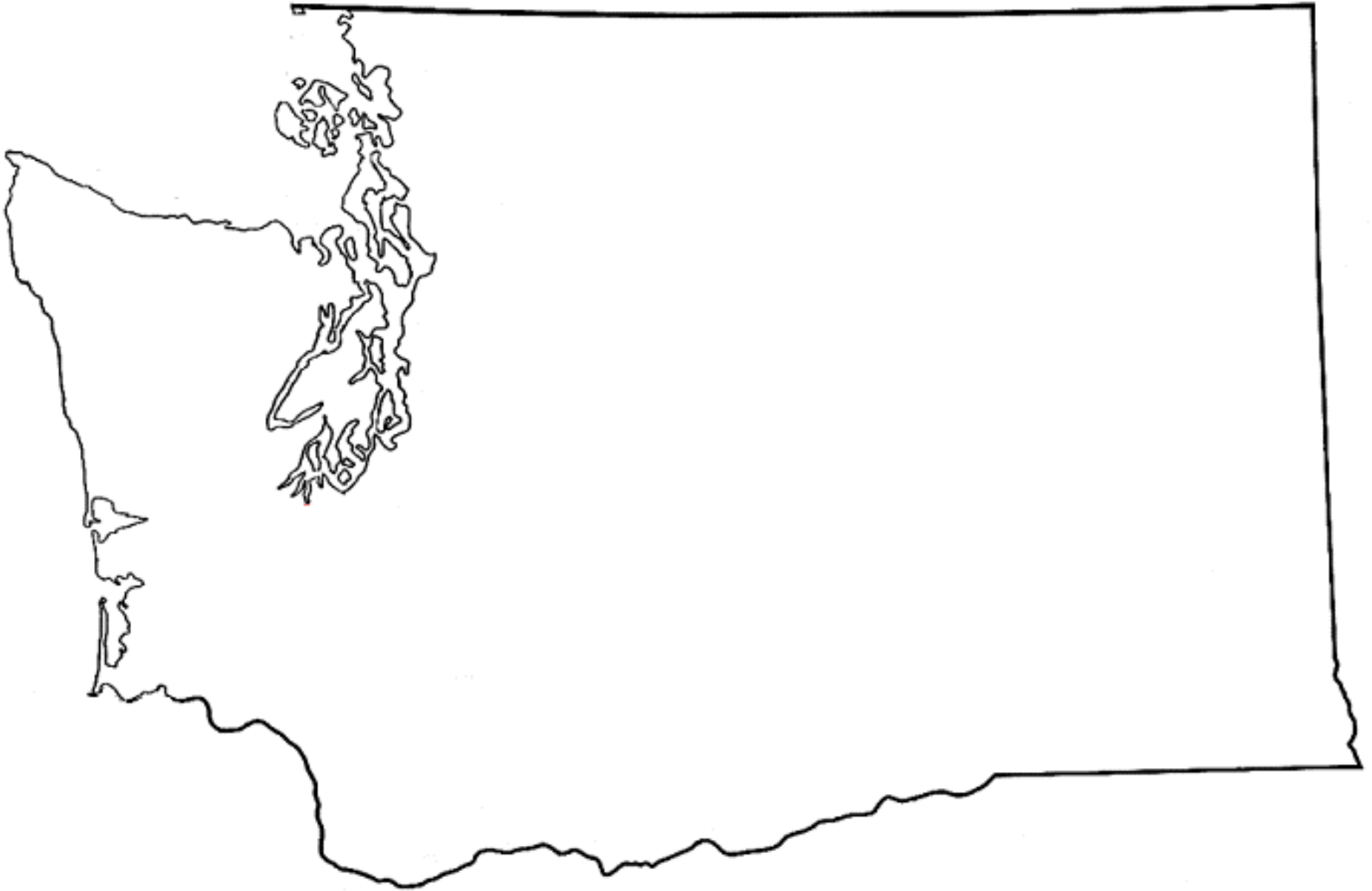

3. Research & gather information about Washington State using at least 3 resources. Organize your findings and prepare a presentation using media (i.e. PowerPoint, brochure, poster board) that includes the following information:

- Year that Washington became a state
- Factual information such as a description of the state flag, it's nickname, tree, flower, bird, & state song
- Washington is in what region of the United States?
- Area / Size of the state
- Population of the state
- Geographic description of the state
- Identify the state's capital & several major cities
- Agricultural, industrial & manufacturing information
- Interesting facts, tid-bits, or legends
- Map or photos of Washington State
- Works cited / bibliography

4. Plan a road trip within Washington State that you would recommend a visitor or tourist taking while visiting Washington using the following requirements and limitations. This will require careful and detailed planning on your part as well as persuasive & convincing language.

**Requirements:**

- This should be 2-3 pages of text (typed & double spaced) in addition to a cover page, graphics or pictures, and a bibliography.
- Structure:
  - **Introduction:** Write a vivid overview of the trip.
  - **The body paragraphs:** Describe each of your destinations and why you chose them. Include the following details:
    - Mode of transportation and major routes to and from each location.
    - Number of days & nights at each location.
    - Things to do at each location.
    - Anticipated expenses for each location.
  - **The conclusion:** This is where you tie up any loose ends you haven't included already and persuade your readers why this trip would be fabulous! Persuade your reader to really want to go on the trip!

**Limitations:**

- Your starting point is Bellingham.
- You can decide what type of transportation to use. You may use more than one type (car, boat, train, bicycle, etc.)
- You must include a minimum of three stops to specific locations of interest (not just the name of a city). These could be historical landmarks, tourist attractions, parks, or other interesting or unique activities to see or do in our state.
- Your trip must take you to at least two different geographical regions (across the mountains, forest, plateau, desert, etc.)
- The trip must last a minimum of 3 days but no longer than 10 days.
- It must be realistic! For example, you cannot drive 2000 miles in a day or fly back and forth across the state on a private jet.
- Your trip must cost less than \$2000 total so consider gas prices, admission into activities, food, lodging, etc. (Make sure there really are places to stay nearby your stops!)
- Include a map of Washington with your route and stops clearly marked.
